St Mary's Belfry update

St Mary's church building never ceases to surprise us. We are currently involved in a project to strengthen the ancient oak bell-frame, for which a grant of some £30,000 is coming from the Diocesan Bellringer's Guild. As part of the project, the old, ugly fibre-boarded ringing room ceiling from 1950 has been stripped out and, to our surprise, revealed many more ancient oak beams, probably dating back to the mid 1700s that we never guessed were there. As part of the project a new timber ceiling will be constructed that will ensure these old timber beams can be seen in all their ancient glory. *Rod Pierce*



Voices from Prison

In the latest article in our Parish Blog several members of the congregation describe the impact on them of visiting HMP Send and HMYOI Feltham to witness the final week of the Sycamore Tree Restorative Justice course.

At the Parochial Church Council meeting on 16 September the following items were discussed:

- A 'mourning box' is available in the office in case of an event of national significance.
- Holy Trinity School has received an excellent report after its Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools.
- A First Communion group is being prepared this term.
- A Youth Group for teenagers older than those who go to Cafe Club is proposed.
- A youth visit to Kwasa in 2020 is being planned after an initial meeting showed enthusiasm.
- The Safeguarding self-audit and action plan was endorsed.
- The Health & Safety policy was adopted.
- Progress on the HT sound system contract was reported.
- Investigation into digital giving was reported, aimed at casual visitors.

The hot topic of the summer is the devastation of the High Street, with more and more shops and national brands closing. During the first week of June alone, four more outlets closed at the top of Guildford High Street, leaving a gaping emptiness. A pattern which will only be repeated when Debenhams closes next year and Arcadia shops fall under threat. Retail, as we knew it is fundamentally different. Town Centres are not the 'centres' for social activity they used to be.


So, where is the good news for the community and life on the High Street? What reason is there to come to the 'centre'? Looking around the top end of Town, life seems to be where the flags are flying – and, more-often-than-not, that is from the railings of Holy Trinity Church. And, the invitation is not only about worship, it is about coming: to a concert, to a folk festival, to a play, to an opera or an exhibition....

Holy Trinity and St Mary's are popular venues for art events in the Town. Holy Trinity Church is a large, flexible, beautiful space with good acoustics. Access is good and prices very affordable. Spaces like these are relatively rare and hence their increasing popularity for cultural events. But they also have their limitations; mainly due to their being multi-purpose. But, is this a sign of things-to-come? Will the High Street be reinvented and rediscover its mojo by replacing Retail with Culture? Long-term trends have been signalling how our social needs are shifting away from 'stuff' and toward 'experiences''. More and more, we need our spirits lifting with a play, beautiful music, a thoughtful piece of art, rather than a new dress. To keep a heart in the High Street there is more and more need for space for cultural experiences. We are looking forward to it!

The navy wool has been paid for by a donation so we are just asking for your time and skill - perhaps it's time to learn to knit! If you would like to knit a hat (or hats!), you'll be asked to sign out your ball of wool (we will all be using wool from the same supply to ensure a uniform colour) and then return hat(s) and leftover wool in the bag provided. We would like to involve as many people as possible from outside the parish in this project so please ask friends and family if they would like to help Knit for Kwasa.

Beware of Scam Calls. Scam/Fraudulent automated telephone calls are on the increase and can sound very plausible and official. Currently two of the most common are:

- 1) An automated call purportedly from BT saying that your internet connection had been compromised and that you should 'press 1' to speak to someone. This is likely to redirect you to a *premium rate phone number* (as well as the scammers). Just hang-up and, if possible, block. The website www.bt.com/help/home/scams/ tells you that they will never call you like this. It also gives you further advice as well as a link to a page where you can log the call so that they can investigate. Dial 1471 and this may give you the telephone number that called you.
- 2) An automated call claiming to be from Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC) claiming Tax Fraud had been logged against your name and that an arrest warrant could be issued against you if you do not "press 1" to speak to an HMRC agent. This is also likely to redirect you to a *premium rate phone number*. More details have been issued by Police here: www.gloucestershire/
