Guildford Action is based in the Beverley Hall in Haydon Place. There is a day centre for people who are sleeping rough and those who have challenging mental health needs. How do you wash and dry denim trousers, register with a doctor when you have no home and

multiple other problems? GA gives access to food, medical help, foot care, and washing facilities. It also offers groups to help build confidence, for example, fishing trips or outings to the cinema.

GA also provides help at home and in community groups for children and families suffering from the pressures of domestic abuse, low income, parenting and housing worries. During the last year the highly committed staff have seen the transfer to Universal Credit causing massive difficulties, extra use of food banks and a rising number of children unable to take part in after school and out of school activities. Meanwhile the threshold for access to statutory services continues to rise; so Guildford Action's work is critically important and our interest and support are much valued.
