Nazareth Way is a charity founded upon Christian principles to promote the work of prison chaplaincies in Surrey and in particular to provide resources and

support for the chaplaincy at our local women's prison, HMP Send.

The chaplaincy team, which includes about 80 volunteers, supports women of all faiths and none. Nazareth Way funds volunteer and mentor training, course materials for the women, a small Christmas gift for every prisoner, small grants and safe transport on release, books, CD and DVD library, social activities within the Chaplaincy and much more.
