Trinity Club, Tuesday 28 January - The Story of Ruth and Naomi; a world on fire. David Uzzell will discuss some of the issues around what is now being called the 'climate emergency'. The starting point for the discussion will be two recently published books. The first is Ruth Valerio's *Saying Yes to Life*, which is the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book for 2020. The second book is Naomi Klein's recently published *On Fire: The Burning Case for a Green New Deal*. Each offers a very different agenda for our priorities in terms of dealing with the climate emergency. *David and Brian*

On Monday the following were discussed and approved:

- Finances: the 2019 report, the budget for 2020, and preparations for Planned Giving renewal in June. Of particular interest is the establishing of a fund for Children and Young People, using a kind donation from the Arbuckles. This will replace the now defunct Olave Duncomb Fund, and enable more to be done.
- Detailed discussion of the trials of the sound system and what the questionnaires of the congregation revealed ended with agreement that the new system should be installed, subject to diocesan approval.
- The Archbishop of Canterbury will be visiting Guildford on March 18th and 19th.
- The Silver EcoChurch award certificate was shown, to general approval.
