



Dear Friends,

A friend sent me a quotation from something I wrote in 2014. It was moving that she had kept and treasured these words all that time; but I was anxious before I opened the attachment, unsure whether I would stand by what I had written. Apparently, I had been reflecting on the hymn "Lord of the dance" by Sydney Carter, and had said:

Perhaps one part of his style is its open-endedness. A faith that is ready to learn, respectful of others, keen to penetrate dark situations to look for the light, is very attractive. It was noted that Carter's songs would change from rehearsal to rehearsal – indeed, from performance to performance. I have seen that too when I have been fortunate to be close to Will Todd at work. He has re-configured some of his "completed" pieces for different arrangements of voices and instruments, to suit the resources of this parish. The song remains the same – but we hear it differently as new people are drawn into the singing. That, perhaps, is an image of what happens around Jesus – his divine song remains the same, but must be heard and sung afresh in each generation.

Well, this Christmas is definitely going to be different – but we still need to hear and proclaim the message: "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness does not overcome it". That is the truth that comforts. That is the truth that is familiar, faithful and fresh in each moment when we behave to make it real.

This is how our Christmas services will work.

Option A: Church-at-home via Zoom

This is ideal for those who are protecting themselves or a family member, or who enjoy singing – you can sing along with the choir at home on Zoom, in a way that is not permitted in church.

Option B: Church-at-home via YouTube - Live or Recorded Service

Make good use of our livestreaming to <u>YouTube</u>. The quality is the same. You can sing and pray. You can catch up with our worship at a time to suit yourself.

Option C: Come to Holy Trinity – seating is limited

Please consider attending one of the new services this year: Carol Service at 5pm on December 20th; Christmas Eve service at 6pm; Christmas Day service at 11am. There is no booking system; the limited number of seats can only be allocated on 'first come, first served'. Please spread the word.
