A duty of care

Between the first Christmas Day, and the first Good Friday, Jesus changed. At the beginning, as a newly born infant, he was cared for, as he could do nothing for himself. That is a tender part of the Christmas story – that God was content to be completely vulnerable, in the care of others.


By the end of his life, Jesus was the one who cared, showing in word and action the tender compassion that brought hope and healing to many. His example is our inspiration to be carers ourselves. Yet, in the middle of his life, Jesus combined both: he offered and accepted care. Think of the story when he was thirsty, asking water from a stranger, unembarrassed to be in need (John 4.7).

It is part of our spiritual journey into mature adulthood that we can be both cared for and carers. If we never let anyone look after us, then we distance ourselves, probably in a proud and unhelpful way.

Now, as the regulations for this part of the country are tightened, however much we may feel constrained, we have a duty of care – to look after ourselves, our neighbours and friends, those we may meet in the street, and those we may be accustomed to sitting next to in church.

I am confident that you will make a responsible decision about church-going. I am

helped by remembering that this year, 2020, is so unusual – and that, God willing, we can look forward to a fully joyful Christmas at the end of 2021. Until then, please take care.



If you are coming to Holy Trinity, please wrap up warm so that we can ensure the building is as ventilated as possible. Please consider coming to one of the services apart from the 10am on Christmas Day, so that we can spread the congregations out as effectively as possible.

Please note that, for safety's sake, we have cancelled the Christmas Eve service at St Mary's (that was to have been at 9pm). All those familiar with worship at St Mary's (Methodist and Anglican) are specifically invited to the 6pm Christmas Eve service at Holy Trinity instead.

To give everyone a moment of ease, we are asking that the congregation at 10am on Sunday 27th December stays at home. Holy Trinity church will be open for ministers and the tech team, so that the service can be broadcast on Zoom and YouTube as usual. Of course, the doors will still be open if anyone turns up unexpectedly.

Thank you to the "tech team" for all you have done this year to keep us together as one parish, one worshipping community. You have enabled us to remain united and to participate fully in worship, wherever we have been. In particular, thousands of people benefitted from your work in broadcasting and recording the Ordination service at Holy Trinity in October, for Tom and three other ministers. You have

overcome last minute problems, hosted breakout rooms, and made worship beautiful in a way that most of us had never even considered possible.

And also a BIG "thank you" to Susie Alcock who has circulated these weekly letters. Susie has designed the letters, making complicated information as accessible as possible. Each week, sometimes at the eleventh hour, Susie has helped us stay in touch with each other. Brilliant!

The next letter will be published on Thursday 7th January. Morning Prayer will continue until 23rd December, and re-start on Monday 4th January.

Message from the Treasurer

Thank you so much to everyone who has given to the Parish in 2020. It has been a difficult year for us all individually and as a Parish but the response to requests for financial support have been humbling. As a Parish we have met fully our obligations to our employees and to our Outward Giving commitments.



At the same time we have developed new ways of making services and other resources available to those at home and made the churches safe environments for those wishing to come in person. We have done this despite losing significant income from the letting of our buildings and from collections in church.

The response to the CAF Donate Red Button on the web site, to the Contactless Giving handset in Holy Trinity and to requests to consider a review of Planned Giving commitments has been magnificent and means that although the Parish will still have a deficit in 2020 it will be much smaller than originally envisaged.

We will continue to minimise expenditure where we can but with the latest Covid restrictions the beginning of 2021 will be just as difficult as 2020 and the future remains uncertain.
