Kwasa College Development

The Kwasa College Board has actioned the formation of two roles at Kwasa College:

- 1. Rector** – who is to be responsible for the overall vision and leadership of the school, preservation of the ethos, organising of chapel activities, as well as fulfilling the role of Chaplain to the children, staff and the community. In addition the Rector is responsible for maintaining existing, and forging new relationships with partners/donors. This position has been filled by myself since 1 August 2018.
- 2. Head of Primary School** – responsible for the administration, discipline and educational aspects of the school. (The creation of this position has been made possible by the generosity of donors from Chapel-of-the-cross in North Carolina – we are deeply indebted to them).

Owen Myrddin Thomas has accepted the Board's offer of this post, and will be appointed as from 1 January 2019. I quote Fr. Angus Patterson; "Owen is one of a kind.... he has lived his life in education as a sacrifice for other people's children... Owen is an artist, a shaper of young people's lives. His total commitment to the well-being of every young charge under his care, and the tailoring of schools to serve the pupils in every aspect of their lives, is his chief passion."

I am very excited about working alongside Owen as we continue to develop Kwasa College in line with God's plan for all who are associated with it, and welcome Owen and his wife Clair to the Kwasa family.
